# Advisory Committees to the Surgeons General of the War and Navy Departments and U.S. Public Health Service 1940-1948

Correspondence Files of the National Research Council Division of Medical Sciences' Advisory Committees

Against the backdrop of the war in Europe, in April 1940 Lewis Weed, Chairman of the National Research Council's Division of Medical Sciences, offered the services of the Division to advise the Army and Navy on medical problems relevant to the armed services. Soon afterward, James Magee, Surgeon General of the Army, requested Weed to establish committees to provide advice to the Army Medical Corps. One month later, following the concurrence of the Surgeons General of the Navy Department and the U. S. Public Health Service, the first two committees—one on chemotherapeutics, the other on transfusions—were organized. With the entry of the United States into the war in December 1941, the number and scope of medical problems confronting the armed services multiplied. Accordingly, over the course of the war, the Division of Medical Sciences' Advisory Committees to the Surgeons General eventually grew to encompass fourteen committees and 42 subcommittees.

Working through the Federal Government's Committee on Medical Research (CMR), which was placed under the Office of Scientific Research and Development, the Advisory Committees provided professional advice and served to plan and administer medical research projects related to the war effort. In practical terms, this meant that the committees would meet, sponsor conferences on medical topics, submit reports and recommendations, and allocate research projects to investigators affiliated with various institutions. In fact, the bulk of the Advisory Committees' correspondence files document activities of this type.

With the end of the war, the Advisory Committees' work was largely finished. Most of the committees were disbanded, although some continued to function into the early postwar years.

The correspondence files of the Advisory Committees to the Surgeons General of the War and Navy Departments and U.S. Public Health Service span approximately eighteen linear feet in nine file cabinet drawers. The files cover the years 1940-1948, with the bulk of the collection covering 1940-1945.
